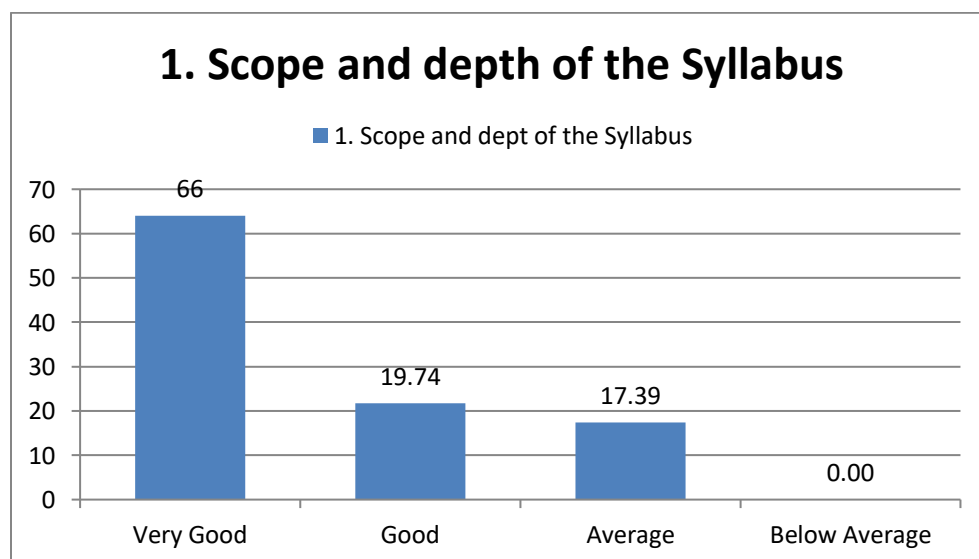
Analysis of Feedback by Student on Curriculum-2023-24

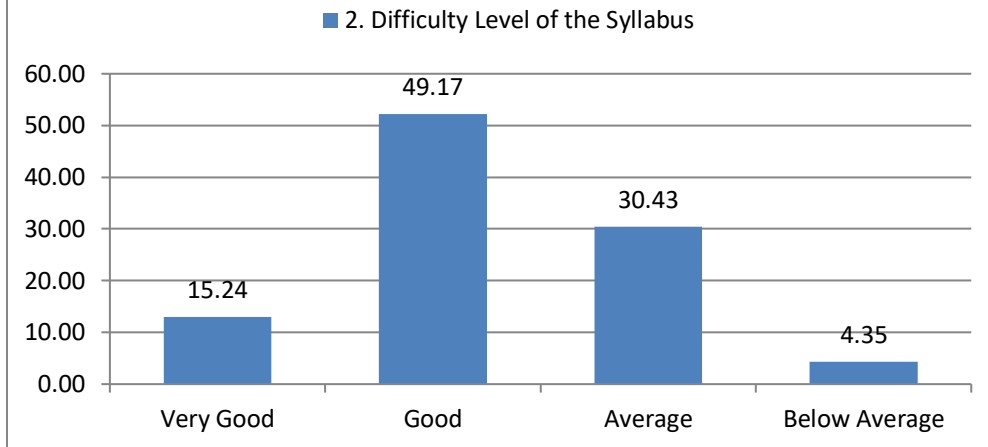

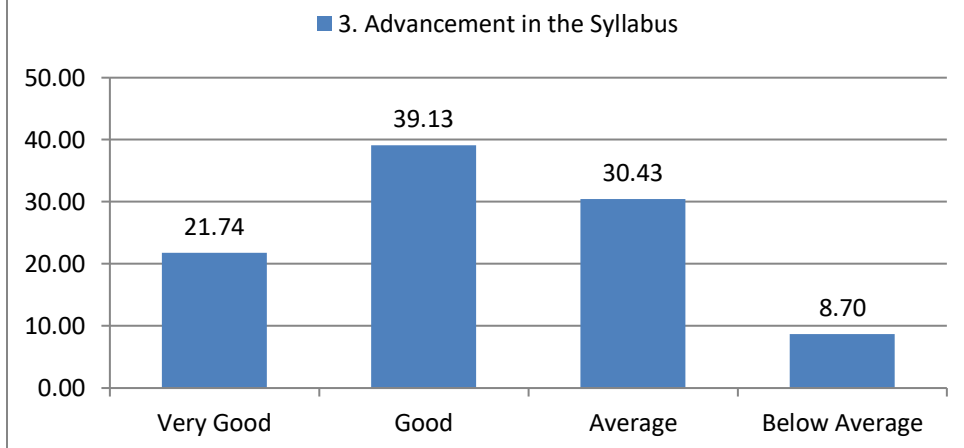
The above question was with regards to major the level of scope and depth of the syllabus in curriculum. Majority of the students are of the opinion that syllabus Scope and Depth is Very Good.

2. Difficulty Level of the Syllabus

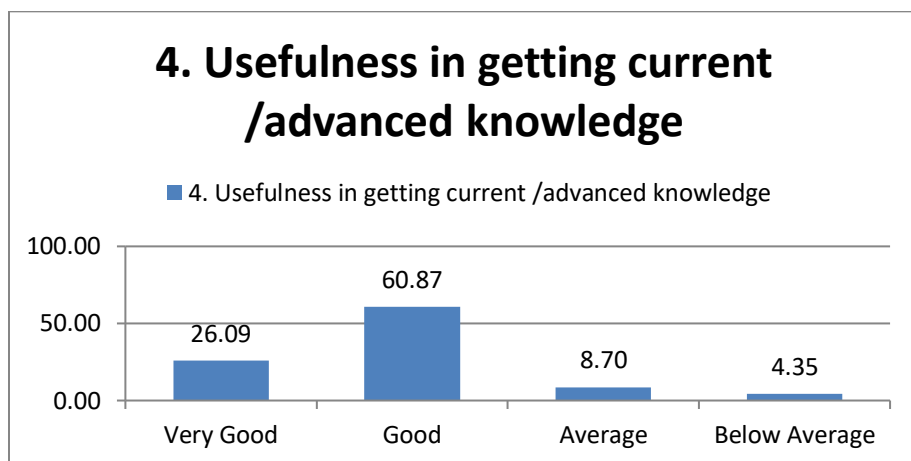

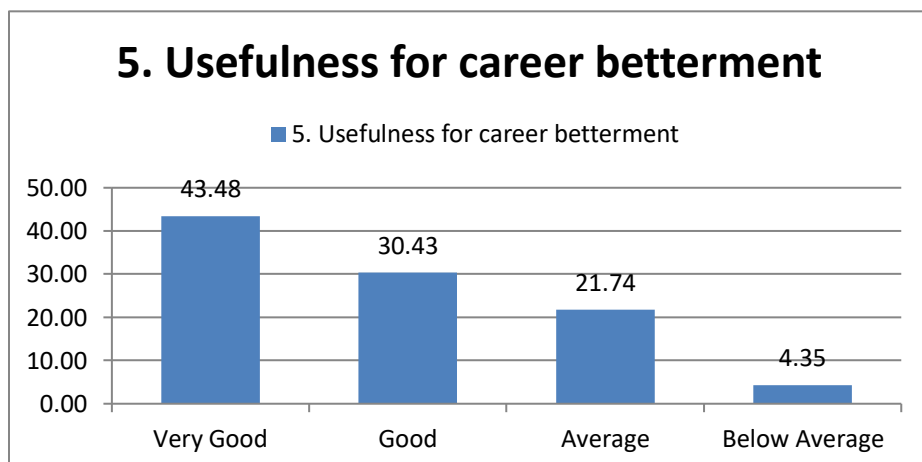
3. Advancement in the Syllabus
